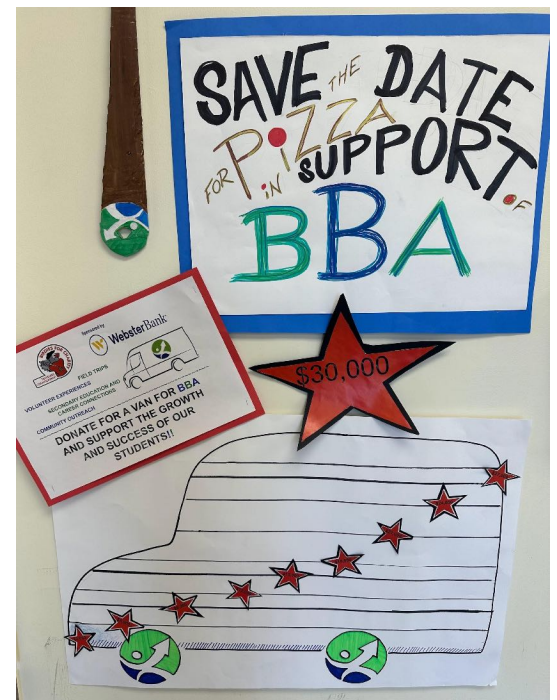

In Emily's science class, students are learning about renewable and nonrenewable resources. They spent time learning about the importance of using renewable resources such as solar panels and windmills. In their most recent science lab, the boys created two types of windmills, one with three blades and the other with four. Then, they tested each to see which windmill would wind up the weighted

string quicker.

## Candy Bombers

In collaboration with a Middle School History class learning about The Cold War, students created their own "Candy Bombers," just as Lt. Gail Halverson dropped treats to the children during the Berlin Airlift in 1948. The STEM challenge involved planning, problem-solving, and implementing a parachute made of coffee filters, tissue paper, etc., that would hold one piece of candy and one piece of gum and take at least three seconds to reach the ground.

The College Fair is sponsored by the National Association for College Admission Counseling (NACAC). This event is free and open to all students and parents in the area.

In addition to asking questions, students and parents will be able to set up college interviews, pick up literature, and learn about the various financial aid programs available.

admission representatives. To compare several schools, plan on asking the same questions at each table.
